Inspiring a culture of philanthropy in Westmoreland County.



About Visionaries:

This program was launched in 2010 and invites early- and mid-career professionals who want to improve Westmoreland County through philanthropy. Participants donate to the Visionaries Fund and — with professional guidance and support — learn more about the needs of Westmoreland County. They engage with peers to fund nonprofit organizations addressing one of those needs. The program culminates in a "Pitch-In Party" where participants leverage funds as select nonprofit organizations share their missions.

Ideal Participant:

- Westmoreland County working professionals and/or residents ages 22-40 who are not currently working in the nonprofit sector and want to learn more about pressing needs within the community and the charitable organizations addressing those needs.
- Westmoreland County businesses that want to enhance their current charitable involvement in the community or expand professional development opportunities for younger employees.

Program Commitment:

- Participants commit to attending three in-person/virtual evening learning sessions and "Pitch-In Party" and engage in networking with peers.
- Individuals can personally contribute a \$500 participatory donation or secure that amount via their employer or similar sponsor.

• This event will bring together generational givers — Visionaries past and present, and CFWC donors — to network and celebrate the grant recipients, as identified by the Visionaries cohort.
